NEW DEAL FOR TEACHERS' PAY

A new two year pay agreement for Scotland's teachers has been agreed today by the Scottish

Negotiating Committee for Teachers (SNCT).

The Agreement provides a pay uplift of 1% per annum for 2013-14 and 2014-15, improvements to

rates of pay for short-term supply teachers and changes to teachers' terms and conditions.

Michael Russell, Cabinet Secretary for Education and Lifelong Learning, said: "It is good news that

agreement has been reached on a pay increase for teachers across Scotland who are doing a great

job and making a real difference to the education and future of our young people. These have been

long negotiations but the Scottish Government has been committed throughout to working positively

to secure a positive outcome. This is a fair agreement in the current financial climate and

demonstrates the benefits of close partnership working."

COSLA HR spokesperson Councillor Billy Hendry, the Employers' Side Chair, said: ""We welcome

the overwhelming acceptance of this pay deal for teachers and the certainty this gives for industrial

relations at a critical time for Scottish Education. The increased flexibility associated with the

McCormac proposals on teacher class contact time will benefit teachers and pupils alike and are

particularly to be welcomed in this deal."

EIS Salaries Convener Tom Tracey, the Teacher's Side Chair, said: "This has been a difficult set of

negotiations but we are pleased to conclude the discussions with an agreement which improves the

situation on short-term supply and secures a pay award for all teachers."

Full details of the pay agreement:

The SNCT has agreed a number of proposals in relation to pay and conditions of service:

A two year pay deal. 1% pay increase for 2013-14 and 1% increase for 2014-15.

- Short term supply to be defined as two days (from 1 April 2014).
- No cap on the maximum class contact time for short-term supply teachers.
- An automatic 10% pay uplift for preparation and correction time for all short-term supply teachers.
- The revised SNCT package arising from the McCormac recommendations to be implemented from 1 August 2014.
- SNCT issuing a statement of teacher professionalism.
- Working Group: a tri-partite working group chaired by COSLA to be established and tasked with identifying practical answers to common issues with the availability of supply teachers.
